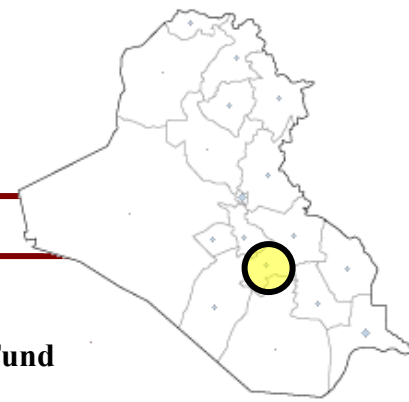

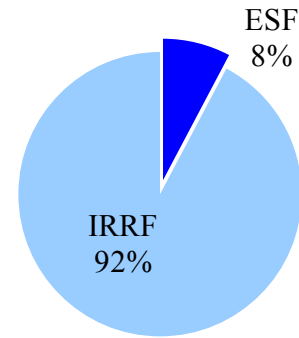

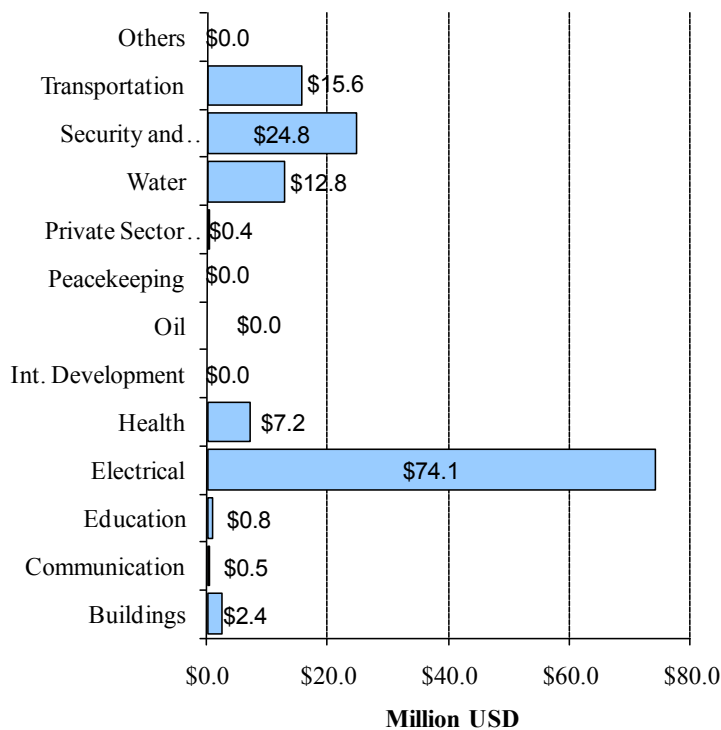

IRRF Spending By Sector (\$ mil.)



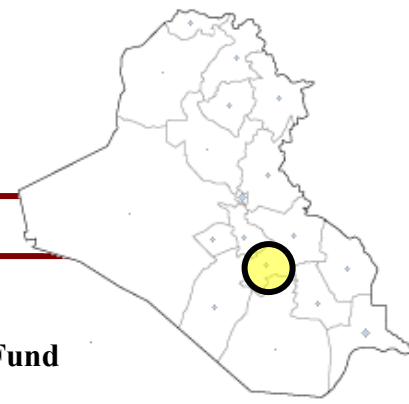

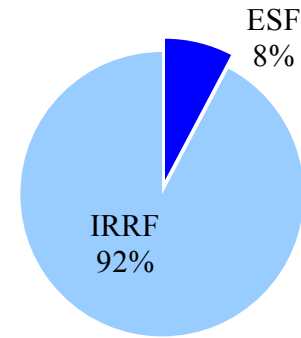
Qadisiyah Funding Overview: Department of State Funds



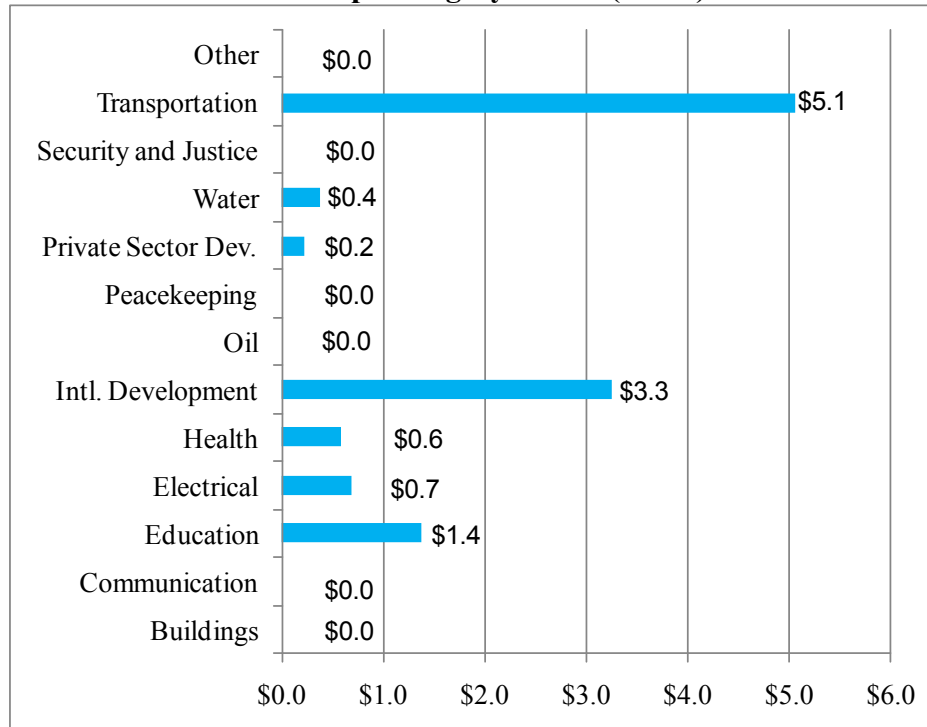

Spending By Fund



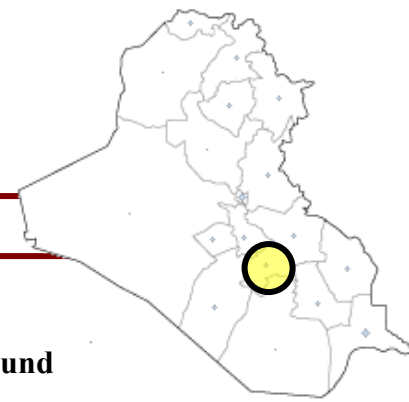
ESF Spending By Sector (\$ mil.)

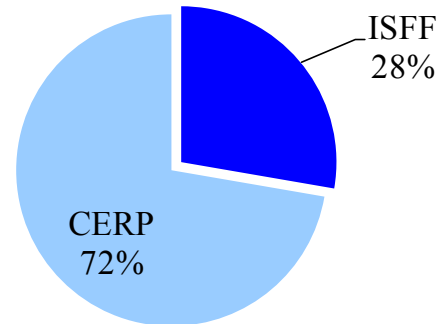

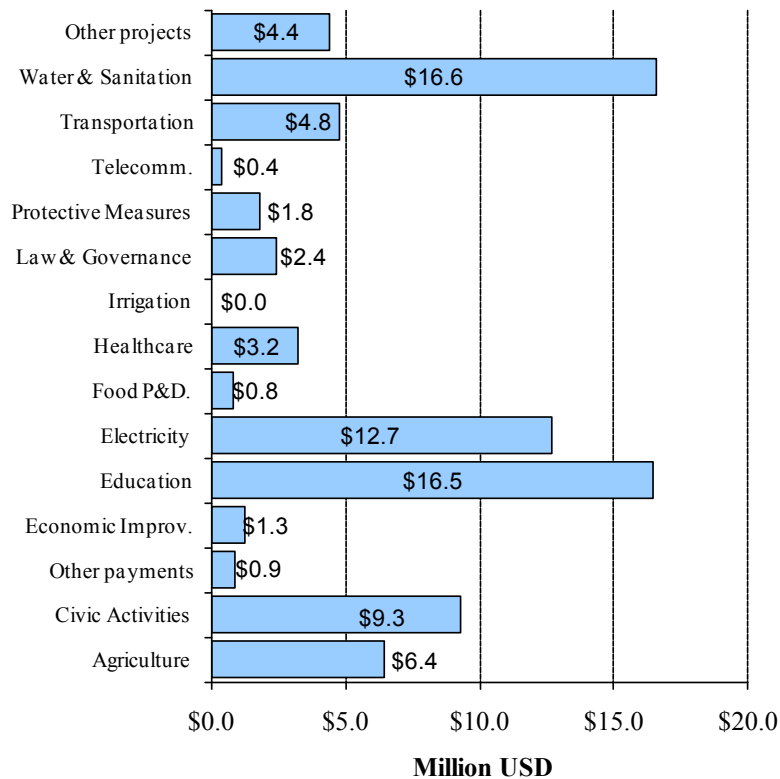

QADISIYAH PRT & PRDC ACTIVITIES



PRT Highlights

- On April 9, 2009, the PRT visited the Diwaniyah Maternity and Children’s Hospital to check on the progress of a USG project to replace the hospital’s four elevators. Per the contractor, two of the elevators have been replaced and are pending inspection. The hospital has been operating with only one functioning elevator since the Spring of 2008 while the contractor made sporadic attempts through 2008 to complete the contract. The PRT will continue to monitor this project until completion. While at the hospital teddy bears were presented to some of the children being treated at the hospital. This gesture was warmly received.
- On April 2, the PRT joined with staff and students of Diwaniyah’s Agricultural High School for the inauguration of its fish hatchery; both the PRT and school collaborated on this project. The hatchery allows the school to expand its aquaculture curriculum to include all phases of fish production from inception to harvest, and provides an additional source of income to the high school through the sale of fingerlings to local farmers. Until now, the high school and local producers were obliged to obtain fingerlings from aquaculture facilities in Babil province. The project has reinforced the strong working relationship fostered between the PRT and the Agricultural High School, which has shown a sincerity in their desire to find ways to help address social and economic concerns. The hope is to build upon this relationship by pursuing additional projects, including a honey production initiative and well drilling training, that will not only train the students but will directly serve the people of Diwaniyah.

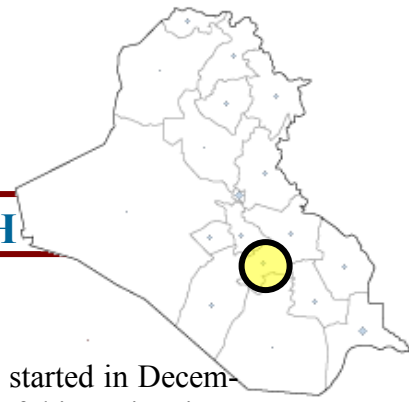
PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

- **Al Samawah Carriageway.** The \$8 million project started in May 2005 and was completed in August 2008. Its objective was to rehabilitate Expressway 1, the major north-south route in Iraq, a vital asset for the economic sustenance and growth of Iraq. As traffic volume increases from Baghdad towards Basrah, the second carriageway from Al Diwaniyah to Al Samawah is vital for the efficient traffic flow relieving traffic jams.
- **Al Diwaniyah Maternity & Children’s Hospital.** The \$4 million project started in February 2005, was completed in April 2006. The project was to improve the healthcare facility and critical infrastructure systems to extend the useful life of the facility for at least a decade until the facility can be renovated or replaced in a manner that will best serve the transforming healthcare system.

PROJECTS IN PROGRESS - QADISIYAH

PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

- The ESF funded project to **Reconstruct Roads in Al-Taamem District**, started in December 2008 and is scheduled to be completed in September 2009. The intent of this project is to remove and reconstruct thirty six asphalt, concrete and dirt roads for everyday use within the coordinates.
- ***Diwaniyah 132 Kv AIS Substation—Construct new.** The \$26 million project started in July 2005 and is scheduled to be completed in April 2009. The voltage of the line is 132kV. The project is reported as 99% complete. Construction activities are progressing in many areas at site.
